




Map showing COVID-19 laboratory confirmed cases




COVID-19 confirmed cases by date of laboratory confirmation (as of 4-5-2020,7:00 PM) n= 161








COVID -19 confirmed cases by age group (as of 4.5.2020), n= 161



Preparedness and Response to COVID-19 in Myanmar



Summary of COVID-19 cases (as of 4.5.2020)

- The first two COVID-19 laboratory confirmed cases were detected on 23 March, 2020.
- The highest number of cases were found in week-16 (2nd week of April) i.e. about 3 week after first cases and 43% of cases are linked with religious event cluster.
- Numbers of COVID-19 confirmed cases were dramatically decreased at the end of April
 2020 about

87% decreased in number in week-18 compared to week-16.

The possible reasons for this dramatic decreasing are-

- Rapid containment procedure of confirmed cases, Intensified contact tracing and quarantine procedure of those contacts interrupt transmission chain.
- Because of the restriction of all international flights since 30 March 2020, the number of Imported confirmed cases become less in number.
- Asymptomatic and mild cases in the community have not attended to the public hospitals and health facilities and because of this; those cases cannot be tested.
- Currently, not all of the suspected cases, contacts and quarantine people are not tested.
- Stay at home and social distancing are good practice to reduce and interrupt the disease transmission chain.
- Active community participation is crucial in COVID-19 control.
- Recovered = 49 (one-third of cases)
