2021 Application Season for the Hubert H. Humphrey Fellowship

The U.S. Embassy in Yangon is pleased to announce the annual competition for the academic year 2021 Hubert H. Humphrey Fellowship Program.

WHAT: A one-year funded program that sends accomplished professionals to the United States for graduate-level academic coursework and related professional experiences. Fellows are selected based on their potential for national leadership and commitment to public service in either the public or private sector. The Humphrey Program is NOT a degree program and grants are NOT renewable.

WHO: Experienced professionals, scholars, faculty, and others with at least five years professional experience.

To be eligible for a Humphrey Fellowship, applicants:

- · must be from Myanmar and university graduates;
- must have at least five years full time professional experience in the relevant field;
- must have demonstrated leadership qualities, a record of public service and potential for professional advancement:
- · must have written permission from their employers to participate in the program, should they be selected;
- must have a minimum paper-based TOEFL score of 525 (students must take a screening test conducted by the U.S. Embassy if they don't have a TOEFL score, and must take the official TOEFL test after being nominated);
- should have little or no previous experience studying or working in the United States.

ELIGIBLE FIELDS OF STUDY:

- (1) <u>Sustainable Development</u>: Agricultural and Rural Development; Economic Development/Finance and Banking; Natural Resources & Environmental Policy/Climate Change; Urban and Regional Planning
- (2) <u>Democratic Institution-Building</u>: Communications/Journalism; Law and Human Rights; Public Policy Analysis and Public Administration; Trafficking in Persons Policy and Prevention; Technology Policy and Management; Human Resource Management
- (3) Education: Educational Administration, Planning and Policy; Higher Education Administration; Teaching of English as a Foreign Enguage
- (4) <u>Public Health</u>: Public Health Policy and Management; HIV/AIDS Policy and Prevention; Substance Abuse Education, Prevention, and Treatment

IMPORTANT: All grantees are expected to return to their home countries for at least two years at the conclusion of their grant in compliance with the J-visa requirements.

The Humphrey Fellowship covers: international/domestic travel costs, tuition and university fees, accident/health insurance, monthly stipend, and funding for educational nuterials and professional activities. The Humphrey Program does NOT provide financial support for accompanying dependents.

The U.S. Embassy in Yangon is pleased to announce the opportunity to compete for the Fulbright Foreign Student Scholership Program for the academic year 2021.

WHAT: The program gives full scholarship funding to students from Myanmar seeking a Master's Degree at a university in the United States of America.

WHO: Participants are recruited through a merit-based, open competition and chosen based upon their leadership potential, academic excellence, maturity, ability to adjust successfully to life in the United States, and potential to promote mutual understanding between the United States and the people of other countries.

To be eligible for the Fulbright scholarship, applicants:

- must be from Myanmar; individuals of other nationalities are not eligible to apply in Myanmar;
- must hold at least a Bachelor's degree (applicants with advanced degree, e.g. Masters, are also eligible);
- must have a strong academic background and a record of excellence in previous studies;
- must have a minimum paper-based TOEFL score of 575 (students must take a screening test conducted by the U.S. Embassy if they don't have a TOEFL score, and must take the official TOEFL test after being nominated);
- should have relevant degrees or professional experience in their proposed field of study;
- should have little or no previous experience traveling or living in the United States;
- should not have a degree from a U.S. university or he enrolled in a U.S. degree program.

·ELIGIBLE FIELDS OF STUDY: All fields of study will be considered.

IMPORTANT: All grantees are expected to return to their home countries for at least two years at the conclusion of their grant in compliance with the I-visa requirements.

Fulbright Foreign Student Scholarships provide tuition and related academic fees, a monthly stipend for room, board and incidental expenses, supplemental health and accident benefits, a book and equipment allowance, international/domestic travel allowance, and the opportunity to attend Fulbright enrichment activities.

- Item 28 Study/Research Chicotive: The study/research objective description that you provide is an essential and highly important part of your application. You should take great care to write a clear and very detailed description of the program you want to pursue. Clearly identify the area(s) within your field of study in which you want to specialize or concentrate. If there is specific research that you want to accomplish, please describe.
- Item 29 Personal Statement. The personal statement is a narrative statement in which you can include information about your education, practical experiences, special interests, career plans, and your purpose in emplying for study in the U.S. Department of State
- Item 30 Additional Information: This is not a required page; however, if you intend to pursue a professional degree, e.g. business or law, it is recommended that if you attach a professional resume. If you intend to pursue a theoretical, academic degree, a complete curriculum vitae is useful.

University Preference: Please note carefully, it is not an expectation that you will have U.S. university preferences. However, if you do, please is specific. Do not just list the name of a university. Provide the name of the department and the specific program within that department in which you are interested. If you have been in contact or correspondence with a faculty member, please provide the name and contact information for that individual.

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SUPPLEMENTAL FORMS

- Letter of Reference/Recommendation: You must have three letters of reference (or recommendation) submitted on your behalf.
 Letters of reference are extremely important. All letters of reference should be written by teachers under whom you have studied or pursued research or by someone who has supervised you in work related to your proposed field of study. Letters of reference should not be written by persons related to you either by blood or marriage or by personal friends. At least, one academic and one professional or work related letter should be included among the letters.
- Report on proficiency in English: Complete only the top section of this form and have the remaining portion completed by one
 of the types of certified English Language evaluators listed on the form.

SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

1. Transcripts

Applicants must attach official, complete and certified academic documents covering the period of study at universities and other post-secondary institutions. Documents must be accompanied by complete official English Translations.

2. Standardized Tests

You are required to take one or more of the following standardized tests to gain admission to U.S. universities. During initial application stage, you can submit an application without these score certificates. After being selected as one of the shortlisted candidates, you can sit these tests by the arrangement of U.S. Embassy Rangoon.

- Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL): TOEFL is an admissions requirement at U.S. institutions for applicants
 whose native language is not English. All non-native English speaking candidates should immediately register for TOEFL.
- Graduate Records Examination (GRE): The GRE is required by U.S. graduate schools and/or departments for candidates in most fields other than Business Administration and Law.
- 3) Graduate Management Admissions Test (GMAT): GMAT is an admissions requirement for applicants proposing to study Business or Management, as well as any fields which may fall within the scope of offerings of a Business school or department.

OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

I. Duration of Grants

Pulbright grants and other fellowships, assistantships, scholarships and educational grants are generally awarded for one nine to twelve month academic year beginning in August or September. Candidates appointed to certain types of Fullright grants may be required to arrive during the summer for an immediatory course or intensive English program prior to the academic year. In some cases, arrangements may be made for an extension of the period of grant beyond the first academic year. Candidates should not assume, however, that awards are automatically renewable.

2. Duration of Degrees

The length of your degree program may exceed the available funding and sponsorship limits of your Fulbright grant. The requirements for completing academic work toward a degree vary depending upon the degree desired, the candidate's academic background and the regulations of the individual U.S. institution to which the candidate is admitted. It is usually not possible to obtain a degree in one academic year. However, the minimum time required for a Master's degree is one academic year.



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

To be eligible for the Fulbright FLTA scholarship, applicants:

- must be citizens of Myanmar; individuals of other nationalities are not eligible to apply in Myanmar;

- must be teachers of English, or in training to become teachers of English, no older than 30 years of age;
- must hold at least a Bachelor's degree (advanced degrees, e.g. Masters, are also eligible);
- must have a strong academic background and a record of excellence in previous studies;
- must be proficient in English, with a minimum TOEFL PBT score of 550 or TOEFL IBT score of 79-80 or an IELTS score of 6.0;
- should have little or no previous experience traveling or living in the United States;
- should not have a degree from a U.S. university or be carolled in a U.S. degree program

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
